

Ranked as one of the most rapidly improving urban areas (The PWC Good Growth Index), the city is open to investment that secures a sustainable future for all, capitalising on the £5bn National Cyber Force (NCF) facility on Preston's doorstep, creating huge opportunities for commercial development and city living.

As a centre for commerce, culture and innovation, drive and ambition combine with civic pride, distinctive place-making and down-to-earth delivery.

The Vision

Change is driven by a City Investment Plan 2035, outlining a long-term vision to maintain momentum and transform the city, with close to £1bn already invested or committed over the next few years.


This will be achieved through six key strategic priorities:

- // Deliver a new commercial district at Preston Station Quarter
- // Transform Preston's cultural infrastructure
- // Expand and diversify the housing supply, boosting city centre living
- // Ground-breaking approach to community health and wellbeing
- // Support economic recovery, skills, growth and resilience
- // Achieve a step change in a sustainable City Transport Plan

Preston has a successful track record of private/public partnerships to drive its ambitions for change and is fast becoming a UK development hotspot with a wealth of emerging investment opportunities:

- // Award-winning City Living Strategy with 28 sites identified, developed or in planning
- // Harris Quarter Towns Fund £200m Investment Programme led by Preston City Council and Preston Partnership, with 24 development sites identified and kickstarted by a £20.9m Towns Fund contribution for six major projects underway
- // Stoneygate Masterplan An urban village vision: 25 hectares with potential for 1,600 new homes, commercial and mixed-use development
- # £20m Levelling Up Funding for an 'Active Preston' major investment in parks and travel infrastructure
- #40m Transforming Cities Fund investment in infrastructure improvements, including new Cottam Parkway Station and city centre public realm works.





- // Bus Station £25m RIBA award winning refurbishment of the iconic bus station
- // UCLan Masterplan £200m scheme to create a world-class campus in line with UCLan's status as one of the UK's largest universities, including a new Student Centre and public square and the £35m UCLan Engineering Innovation Centre
- // Public Realm Improvements £10m Transformative investment in streets and furniture on Fishergate and Cannon Street

- // Preston Markets £5m Restoration of the 1875 Market Canopy and innovative Box Market
- // Pop Ups Programme £1m programme of events, installations and visitor attractions to promote the city centre, including a Wallace and Grommit sculpture, Mobile Events Tent (MET), City Murals and Animate street hoardings
- // Bishopgate Gardens Private sector investment, conversion of Red Rose and Elizabeth House into 130 luxury apartments - part of the award winning City Living Strategy vision

Key city centre projects

HARRIS QUARTER REGENERATION

- // Major transformation of Preston's cultural and civic heart, breathing new life in the area's heritage assets, key buildings and open spaces to create a diverse cultural, leisure and employment offer, boosting the local economy, increasing footfall and spend in the city centre.
- // Driven primarily through the £200 million Harris Quarter Towns Fund Investment Programme, kickstarted by £20.9 million of Towns Fund investment, to support the following regeneration projects:
 - Animate Entertainment and Leisure Complex £45m cinema, bowling alley, restaurants and public open spaces
 - Harris Your Place £16m refurbishment of the Grade 1 Harris Museum and Art Gallery - one of the most ambitious cultural projects in the North
 - Renewal of Harris Quarter Assets supporting the £7.4m refurbishment of publicly-owned buildings including the refurbishment of the historic Amounderness House into a managed work/office space hub
 - Illuminate and Integrate improving pedestrian and cycleway infrastructure, plus street lighting
 - Preston Youth Zone a multi-million pound new facility for Preston's young people.
 - Educate Preston support hub for schools/colleges providing career advice services
 - Harris Quarter Pop-Ups Programme £1 million investment in events, installations and visitor attractions – including the popular iconic Wallace and Gromit sculpture

PRESTON'S LEVELLING UP FUND

// Regenerating Preston's major parks and delivering new travel infrastructure to bring an enhanced quality of life and health and wellbeing benefits to residents.



- // Regenerating Preston's major parks:
 - Ashton Park major redesign and renewal of the 32ha park, a new community sports hub and sports pavilion, 3G sports pitch and adult/junior football pitches with associated landscaping.
 - Moor Park (Grade II* listed) heritage and public realm improvement works including lake restoration, bridge works and new visitor facilities
 - Waverley Park range of sports/visitor/community facilities and access improvements
 - Grange Park accessibility and lighting improvements to support the re-opening of a building to support community use
- // Delivering new and enhanced active travel infrastructure:
 - Cycle/footbridge over the River Ribble to replace the Old Tram Bridge
 - Cycle paths and walkways greener, safer and more user friendly. includes segregated routes along Queen Street and Avenham Lane
 - Major public realm works with cycle link located at Friargate South
 - Mobility hub providing a secure cycling facility at Preston Bus Station
- // Helping people stay active/healthy, making parks more attractive quality places, improving the well-being of communities and improving the transport network to encourage more people to walk or cycle





CITY LIVING STRATEGY

- // Transforming Preston City Centre and its inner suburbs into a series of vibrant and popular neighbourhoods which exemplify the best of modern city living
- // Creating a thriving city centre apartment market
- // Delivering new high-density homes in the city's inner suburbs
- // Boosting the city's supply of new market and affordable homes in some of the city's key regeneration areas

STONEYGATE MASTERPLAN

- Creating a distinctive urban village within Stoneygate including 25 hectares and one of the largest regeneration opportunities in Preston City Centre
- // Delivering 1,600 homes bringing back into use a number of empty and derelict buildings in the under-used part of the city
- // Encouraging public/private sector partners in the regeneration and development of Stoneygate as a mixed-use urban village
- // Providing a safe, engaging, connected, enterprising, inclusive, people orientated environment for local residents, students, businesses, community groups and visitors

PRESTON STATION OUARTER

- Delivering a landmark Grade A office and commercial quarter, strengthening Preston as a strategic commercial hub in Lancashire
- // Providing a welcoming gateway for visitors with an excellent public realm flowing around the city centre
- Embracing city living with high quality homes with immediate access to city centre culture and amenities
- // Creating new commercial opportunities, housing, jobs and growth

TRANSFORMING RINGWAY AND FRIARGATE NORTH

- // Part of Preston's wider city centre plans for sustainable accessibility in the city
- // Reconnecting both sides of the city for easier pedestrian access between the University Quarter and the city centre
- // Increasing bus, walking and cycling options in the city

COMMUNITY WEALTH BUILDING

- // An approach to economic development which aims to build a resilient and inclusive economy for the benefit of the local community
- // Preston is at the forefront of implementing the principles of this approach in the UK and in 2021 launched its Community Wealth Building 2.0: Leading Resilience and Recovery, which sets the direction of travel for the upcoming years

CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION

We're committed to tackling climate change and making Preston net zero by 2030.

To help ensure we reduce our carbon emissions to net zero goal by 2030, we are committed to developing, adopting and implementing a Climate Action Plan to establish clear, measurable actions for the Council to take to reduce the effect of our operations and services on the environment.

The plan will outline:

- // How the Council will work with others to influence and inspire partners across the district, county and region to decarbonise their properties and activities

- // Presenting a long term aim of reducing congestion, providing for better public transport, and transforming the city and the wider sub-region's streets and spaces
- // Recognising the city's economic growth and future development ambitions and strategic importance at sub-regional and pan-Lancashire levels
- // Aligning with and benefitting from Transforming Cities Fund investment to improve public and sustainable transport
- // Moving away from a car-dominated network to an integrated, accessible and sustainable non-car network - reducing congestion, improving public realm space and decreasing levels of air pollution in the city
